



Biographical Note

Ambassador Jean-Marc Hoscheit is accredited as Ambassador to the Kingdom of The Netherlands and as Permanent Representative to the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (O.I.A.C) since September 2017. Mr. Hoscheit is also currently accredited as non-resident Permanent Representative to the African Union (Observer) and Ambassador to Ethiopia since 2010, as well as Permanent Representative to the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) since 2016.

Ambassador Hoscheit was Luxembourg's Permanent Representative to the UN and other International Organization in Geneva and to the World Trade Organization (WTO) between September 2012 and August 2017. He was also at the same time Consul general of Luxembourg to the Swiss Cantons of Geneva, Vaud and Valais.

From 2008 to 2012, Mr. Hoscheit served as Ambassador of Luxembourg to The Netherlands and Permanent Representative to the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (O.P.C.W.). Previously, he served during five years (2003-2008) as Luxembourg's Permanent Representative to the United Nations in New York.

Mr. Jean-Marc Hoscheit served as his country's Ambassador to France from 1998 to 2003. During that time, he was also Permanent Representative of Luxembourg to the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) and Permanent Delegate to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

From 1989 to 1998, Mr. Hoscheit served at the Permanent Mission of Luxembourg to the European Union, where he was in charge of various working groups. From 1993 to 1998, he was Deputy Permanent Representative of Luxembourg to the European Union.

In the Ministry of Foreign Affairs from 1986 to 1989, Mr. Hoscheit worked in the Directorate of Political Affairs, in charge of various geographical sectors. From mid-1985 to 1986, he was Chargé de Mission at the Foreign Affairs Ministry when Luxembourg held the European Union presidency in 1985.

From 1982 to 1985, Mr. Hoscheit was a researcher, then lecturer and senior lecturer at the European Institute of Public Administration (E.I.P.A.), Maastricht (The Netherlands).

At the University of Strasbourg in France, he received a master's degree in law, and another in political science.

Several of his works on European political and institutional questions, as well as on the diplomatic history of Luxembourg, have been published.

He speaks the following languages: Luxembourgish, French, German, English, Italian, Dutch.

Born in Luxembourg, on 11 October 1958, Mr. Hoscheit is married, with two children.
